As consumer TVs and professional display products are becoming increasingly similar in design, each product has special features for specific usage. Here are the basic differences between the two:

CONSUMER TVS



Purchased by consumers for home use



Typically have a brightness rating of up to 350 cd/m²



Reduced input choices due to a need for a simple, HDMI™ or USB connection



Limited onboard cooling is designed for 6 to 8-hour usage; landscape mounting only



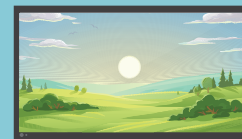
Images can “burn” on the screen if left alone for a long period of time

PROFESSIONAL DISPLAYS



Purchased by businesses; have a more rugged structure for high-traffic areas

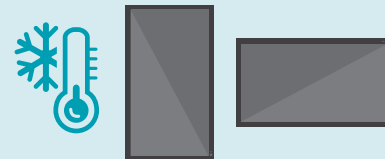


Usually range from 350 to 700 cd/m² to outshine ambient lighting



Has an RS232C input for control, plus a variety of inputs for commercial needs including VGA, DVI and DisplayPort™.

COOLING SYSTEM



Has adequate cooling system to handle 16/7 to 24/7 usage, plus portrait and landscape mounting

IMAGE RETENTION



Has technology to protect against image retention
